I agree with some of the comments about it being difficult to use, install, understand, etc. But, once I got set up I was on my way. This program is PACKED with features. It is essentially a studio in a box. Im not sure amazon will allow it, but here is a link to a song I recorded on MC 4. All parts were tracked separately and drums were imported MIDI tracks from a live drummer. There are some limitations. The default drums sounds arent great and you can only have 20 effects active at one time; which go pretty quickly when you are using compression, EQ, delay, etc. Otherwise, I would give this 5 stars. I have been using this product for 6 years. The only addition I made was adding in addictive drums to get better drum sounds.

Otherwise, I have never upgraded this product as others suggest you have to do. For anyone that has some experience with mixing and recording, this program is a gold mine. Please try again later. Although this product recognized all of my inputs Example Mic In, Line In, it only allows one input to be active. Activating another input requires that the user select the desired input and then shut down the application and restart it. Therefore, more than one input may not be active at one time. This means that you cannot record two tracks simultaneously in stereo. For example, you cannot sing into Mic 1 and have guitar recorded on Line In at the same time. This option is only available if you upgrade. There is no mention of this limitation on the package. The Use Of Real Estate Is Poor The interface for the track view requires you to expand the view for each track to view track details such as input and output. It takes up way too much room and makes the view appear cluttered. NonIntuitive Concepts OverComplicated To Use Example In order to use the software based synth you would think that you would need one track to record the MIDI that has been assigned to output to a particular synthesizer. However you need three tracks Again consuming much real estate One track for the recording of midi with its output set to a synth. One track to receive the output of the synth and the output set to a wave file destination.

WhatYouHear Is Not Necessarily WhatIsExported After creating a short song that sounded ok, I decided to export. The exported wave file sounded great but had no drums. After much reading I figured out that the midi out was being sent to a synth on my sound card. The only way I figured out to play drums was to use the included software based synth which required building a tedious drum map. Conclusion The cost is cheap considering the features. But then you realize this is really an upsale vehicle. That is, you are almost certainly going to pay to upgrade if you want to record anything serious. There are better products on the market. If you are a beginner, this is a hard program to use. I have been multitrack recording for over 20 years and if I had problems understanding how to run this application, you certainly will. The automatic process gets you started, but you have full control over where slices go. And you also free soft synths, audio and MIDI effects. The more expensive Producer Edition adds the wellregarded Sonitus plugin bundle, and now features a video thumbnail track and extensive surround support. Its available in the Producer Edition of Sonar 4 only; surround mixes can be loaded into Studio Edition, but are converted to stereo in the process. Many of us may have no particular need for this option, and the surround hasnt taken off as a music listening format in as big a way as commercial interests would have wanted, but for video games and movie work, its an essential option. Practically any surround format can be chosen — the software is equipped with fixed templates for many different flavours of the different formats — though your audio hardware may have an impact on what can actually be monitored. Standard 5.1 surround is the default for surround sessions, but most varieties up to 8.1 are options. Heres what the new surround panner tool looks like when youre working with a ninechannel 8.1 mix. Moving the mouse in the display lets you change angle and focus thats the crosshair and width the two green balls in an intuitive manner. Your virtual listener is steered between the available audio channels just as easily as if you audio was simply being panned left or right. And no matter which surround format you work in, tracks assigned to the surround buss will be able to be moved in space with the surround panner.

This is a logically designed tool that lets you mouse the audio anywhere between a virtual

representation of the surround speakers and the channels in the surround buss. Though conceptually a little more complicated than stereo panning, in operation its easy. Its also possible to use external surround panning joysticks to take over this job. For example, the bundled Lexicon Pantheon reverb plugin is now available in a sixchannel surround version. Heavy on the CPU, perhaps, but both necessary and worthwhile. Note that while Sonar Producer is capable of mixing more than sixchannel surround, Pantheon is not, and will not load if your session is working with seven or more surround channels. But your nonsurroundcompatible effects can also come out to play Cakewalk have implemented what they call the Surround Bridge, which loads enough instances of an effect, whether mono or stereo, to process all the surround channels in you current session. Its possible to link parameters across bridged effects, though youre able to set up different parameters for each instance if thats whats required. You cant, however, use Surround Bridge to set up a true surround compressor, where a peak in any channel triggers gain reduction in all of them — but thats why Cakewalk have included the Sonitus surround compressor. Editing is limited, but enough to customise the sound set to your own tastes or the needs of a given session. There are no new effects in Sonar 4, beyond the surroundenhanced variants of existing plugins, but there is one new instrument. This is TTS1 above, a multitimbral synth module based on Roland Sound Canvas technology that once again highlights Cakewalks relationship with Roland offshoot Edirol. TTS1 is essentially a General MIDI 2compatible module, but its arrival does beg a question why add TTS1 when Cakewalk were already bundling the VSC Virtual Sound Canvas module with their products.
